

Legal Researcher – Congo River Legal Protection - Request for Proposals

About International Rivers

Consultancy purpose and background

International Rivers is seeking a consultant to produce an analysis outlining the prospects for the permanent protection of portions of the Congo River Basin. This work entails preparing an overview of the legal regimes governing rivers in the basin toward identifying and informing which legal approaches are most promising and likely to be effective in securing permanent protection in law, including the possible application of a rights of nature approach. This will include an assessment of legal tools, including constitutional provisions, litigation and decisions; existing laws, international agreements, conservation areas, and Indigenous and customary law. It will also entail presenting to and consulting with stakeholders including legal experts, civil society, and relevant authorities, and integrating feedback into the report.

Deliverables and Responsibilities

Provide an overview of legal regimes in the Congo Basin related to river governance, including key factors influencing their practical application. This should encompass the possible application of rights of nature principles, existing legislation, and relevant court cases.



Conduct an assessment to determine which legal regimes offer the best opportunities to secure and deliver protections for the Congo River and its tributaries.

Offer recommendations for a strategic framework aimed at securing permanent protections for portions of the Congo River and its tributaries.

The report should detail specific strategies, approaches, and likely activities to attain legal safeguards.

Fee:

A fee up to US \$10,000 will be paid for this project. Prospective candidates should submit a financial proposal with expected hourly or daily fee and breakdown of project costs along with their application.
